Babergh District Council propose to change their Core Strategy for Development to include housing on Greenfield land between Brooklands & Factory Lane . The owners of this land and the Factory site, say this is necessary to make the original Brownfield development viable.

The new proposals could see up to 600 new homes across both sites. It will include some 'Public Open Space', from Decoy Pond to the Sewage Works and south of the Railway line to the foreshore, and infrastructure improvements to roads and services. Local employment on the factory site is hoped for.

This is a major change to the 2008 Strategy and a 6 week Consultation Period related to these changes has now begun. Any Individual, group or community affected may make relevant representations in this period which closes at <u>4.30pm on Tuesday</u>, 9th July, 2013.

NB: This is a Policy process to form the strategy of future plans, NOT a planning application!

The Parish Council invite village residents to this meeting to hear your views and to inform our response. We also hope to have representatives from Babergh D.C and the St Francis Group, the owners of these sites, there to answer any queries.
